REGULAR MEETING

May 11, 2021

The Regular Meeting of the Moweaqua Village Council was called to order by M ayor Neece leading in the Pledge to

the Flag. Roll Call was answered by Kenny Long, Mark Traughber, Shawn Conlin, Mi ke Snyder and Josh Whitney. Employees present were Chief McReynolds, Ramiro E strada, Scott Myers, Sandi Callison, Beth Hawn, Brad Sams,

Virginia Morrell, Mischelle Davis and Attorney for the Village, Scott Garwood was als o present. Others present included Rick Callison, Tiffy Sloan, Tatum Plain, Maddox Plain, Matt Foster, Vickie Lyn, Sara King and Alecia Houston. Conlin made the m otion to approve the Consent Agenda with additions and corrections including the April Year End Meeting Minutes, April Special Meeting Minutes, Bills to be Paid in M ay and Treasurer's Report, Traughber seconded. Council voting Yes: Long, Traugh ber, Conlin, Snyder and Whitney. No: None.

Community Development Committee Chairman Tiffy Sloan presented a loan req uest from Chad Hawkins owner of Hawkins Home Improvement. Hawkins has req uested \$10,000.00 for a term of 7 years. Hawkins plans to purchase a 7' x 14' enclos ed trailer, generator and tile cut saw. After discussion Whitney made the motion to approve a Community Development Loan of \$10,000.00 for Chad Hawkins, Conlin s econded. Council voting Yes: Long, Traughber, Conlin, Snyder and Whitney. Village engineer Mark Bingham presented Request for Loan Disbursement #1 fo r IEPA Loan L175609 in the amount of \$81,878.87 and Payment Estimate #1 in the amount of \$25,200.00 for Hanfland Painting Contractors. Village Engineer Matt Foster presented MFT Bids for seal coating of various stre ets in the Village of Moweaqua. Two bids were received for rock hauling and one bi d was received for oil and chipping. Foster provided a bid tabulation for Council rev iew in advance of the meeting. The bid tabulation is also on file with the Clerk. Afte r discussion Conlin made the motion to approve the MFT bids of \$23,987.50 for roc k hauling to Sloan Brothers Trucking and the bid of \$62,280.00 for oiling and chippi ng to Earl Walker Company, Long seconded. Mayor Neece presented a TIF application submitted by Todd and Angela Knight, owners of TAAB Enterprises. LLC. The Knight's have proposed to construct a patio addition to their existing bar & grill restaurant (The Salty Farmer). It is estimated th at the addition will increase seating capacity by 30 or more people. TIF Consultant Keith Moran recommends that the TIF grant should not exceed 50% of TIF eligible p roject costs. TIF eligible costs are \$13,075.00. Whitney made the motion to grant u p to 50% of TIF eligible expenses for a patio addition at The Salty Farmer, Long seco nded. Council voting Yes: Long, Traughber, Conlin, Snyder and Whitney. No: None .

Attorney Garwood presented Ordinance #2021-

08 Authorizing the Sale of Real Estate.

The property being sold by the Village is situated in Macon County and was being u sed for a municipal water treatment plant. The property is no longer needed due t o the recent completion of the new plant. In the original deed it was stated that if t he land ceases to be used for municipal water plant purposes then the title shall re vert to the Grantor or his assigns upon payment of the sum of \$3,750.00 to the Vill age. Lexipole provides daily training bulletins, policy updat es and also included web-

based delivery and mobile app. Chief McReynolds recommends purchasing a subsc ription to Lexipol which will be an

asset to the Police Department in light of the new laws just coming into effect recently. Whitney made the motion to approve the proposal of \$1,772.00 from Lexipol S olutions for Annual Law Enforcement Policy Manual & Daily Training Bulletins, Long seconded. Council voting Yes: Long, Traughber, Conlin, Snyder and Whitney.

Water & Sewer Superintendent Ramiro Estrada presented an annual renewal quote of \$770.00 from Hach Services

for testing equipment. After discussion Conlin made the motion to approve the qu
